

A RENEWED VISION

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to introduce a renewed vision to all stakeholders within the Halton Catholic District School Board community.

BACKGROUND:

Since the amalgamation in 1969 of the four municipal separate school boards of Burlington, Oakville, Milton and Georgetown into the Halton Roman Catholic Separate School Board, our system has grown and transformed into a vibrant Catholic learning community that provides the best of Catholic education to over 29,000 students across Halton Region at 40 elementary and 8 secondary schools as well as its 2 Continuing Education/Adult Learning Centres.

The Board has become a provincial leader in student achievement in literacy and numeracy, as well as in Special Education and is distinguished by its commitment to servant leadership, continuous school improvement planning, and the preservation of the enduring gift of Catholic education.

This year, the Halton Catholic District School Board commemorates its 40th anniversary as a Catholic school board and celebrates its commitment to Catholic education. Trustees and senior staff worked together to develop a unified vision in order to acknowledge this milestone anniversary, and to provide guidance, direction, and clear aspirational goals for the system as we enter the next phase of our ongoing development and growth.
