Inaugural Board Meeting

The Inaugural Meeting of the 2014-2018 Halton Catholic Board of Trustees took place at Jean Vanier Catholic Secondary School in Milton on Tuesday, December 2, 2014. Once the Board was declared legally constituted, the elections took place for Chair and Vice-Chair. *Jane Michael*, Burlington Trustee for Wards 3 & 6, was elected to be the new Chair, and Burlington Trustee for Wards 1 & 2, *Arlene Iantomasi* was re-elected as Vice-Chair of the Board.

Budget

We are pleased to report that at Regular Meeting of the Halton Catholic District School Board, held on December 16, 2014, we approved the 2014-15 Revised Budget Estimates in the amount of \$353,448,564. The 2014-15 Revised Budget Estimates reflect not only a balanced budget, but an estimated Total Surplus Available for Compliance of \$1,694,735. The Revised Budget Estimates were submitted to the Ministry on December 17, 2014.

The Board of Trustees meet on the first and third Tuesday of each month. Parents and members of the community are welcome to attend!
